DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE (DNS)
WAC 197-11-340**

Description of proposal: SEPA determination for a construction of a 120 foot-long dock and demolition of existing pier and boat cover. The proposed dock will start out at 8 feet wide at the shore and will narrow to 4 feet wide on the lake side. The dock will feature two jet ski lifts and a proposed boat lift.
